

Carillion at Bristol Big Green Week

Making Sustainability a Tangible Subject

Southmead Hospital Regeneration Project is Carillion's largest construction project in the UK and is targeted to be the most sustainable development of its type in the country.

The project sits within the heart of a deprived community and regeneration of the area was a major reason behind its location choice.

The aim is for the hospital redevelopment to act as a regeneration catalyst for the Southmead area, with the result of improving the quality of life for local residents.

Carillion's Southmead Hospital Redevelopment Project backed Bristol's Big Green Week by sponsoring a talk on regeneration with Grand Design's Kevin McCloud.

The BIG Green Schumacher Lecture called "Regeneration for Real: on Ground and in Your Mind" allowed Kevin McCloud to join Rob Hopkins from the Transition Town movement and Tim Smit, founder of the Eden Project.

Bristol's Big Green Week was the UK's first ever international festival of environmental ideas, arts and culture. The festival saw more than 100 events and speakers, spread over nine days from the 9th – 17th June 2013 attracting hundreds of people from across the area and putting sustainability on the agenda of local people.
